
#### **OBJECTIVE**

The Fund seeks total return, consisting of current income and capital appreciation.

### **FUND STRATEGY**

The Fund invests principally in investment-grade debt securities, including U.S. Government obligations, corporate bonds and mortgage-and asset-backed securities. As part of the investment strategy, the Fund may invest in stripped securities or enter into mortgage dollar rolls and reverse repurchase agreements, as well as invest in U.S. dollar-denominated debt securities of foreign issuers. The Fund may also use futures, options or swap agreements, as well as other derivatives, to manage risk or to enhance return. Under normal circumstances, management expects to maintain an overall dollarweighted average effective duration +/-10% relative to the Bloomberg U.S. Aggregate Bond Index.

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#### **Definitions:**

Weighted average coupon: The weighted average annual interest rate (expressed as a percentage of par value) that the issuers of all of the bonds in a fund promise to pay until maturity. Weighted average effective maturity: For a portfolio of bonds, average effective maturity is the weighted average of the maturities of the underlying bonds. The maturities are computed by weighting each bond's maturity by its market value with respect to the portfolio and the likelihood of any of the bonds being called. In a pool of mortgages, this would also account for the likelihood of prepayments on the mortgages.

Effective duration: A duration calculation for bonds with embedded options. Effective duration takes into account that expected cash flows will fluctuate as interest rates change. Yield to maturity (YTM) is the total return anticipated on a bond if the bond is held until it matures.

#### Risks:

Investments in fixed-income securities are subject to interest rate and credit risks. Bond prices fluctuate inversely to changes in interest rates. Therefore, a general rise in interest rates can result in the decline in the bond's price. Credit risk is the risk that an issuer will default on payments of interest and principal. Government bonds are guaranteed as to payment of principal and interest by the U.S. government if held to maturity.
