FUND STRATEGY

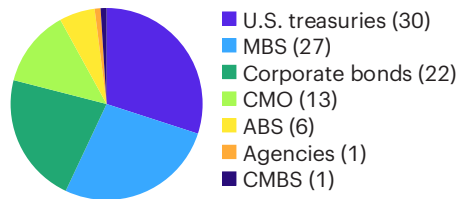

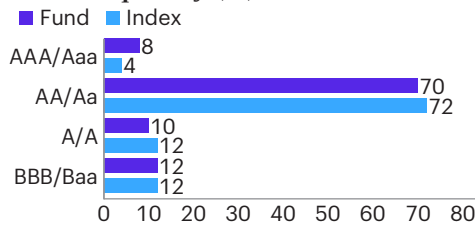

Portfolio composition (%)

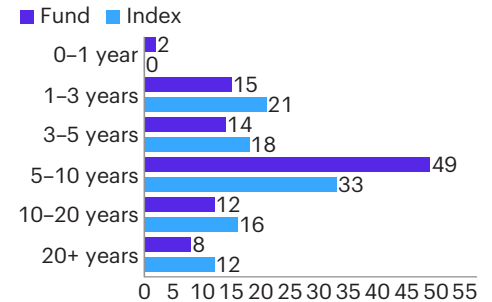


Credit quality (%)

Definitions and Risks:

Weighted average coupon: The weighted average annual interest rate (expressed as a percentage of par value) that the issuers of all of the bonds in a fund promise to pay until maturity.

Weighted average effective maturity: For a portfolio of bonds, average effective maturity is the weighted average of the maturities of the underlying bonds. The maturities are computed by weighting each bond's maturity by its market value with respect to the portfolio and the likelihood of any of the bonds being called. In a pool of mortgages, this would also account for the likelihood of prepayments on the mortgages.

Effective duration: A duration calculation for bonds with embedded options. Effective duration takes into account that expected cash flows will fluctuate as interest rates change.

Portfolio turnover is calculated by taking either the total amount of new securities purchased or the amount of securities sold (whichever is less) over a particular period, divided by the total net asset value of the fund.

Yield to maturity (YTM) is the total return anticipated on a bond if the bond is held until it matures.

High portfolio turnover may result in increased expenses and higher short-term capital gains.

Risks:

Investments in fixed-income securities are subject to interest rate and credit risks. Bond prices fluctuate inversely to changes in interest rates. Therefore, a general rise in interest rates can result in the decline in the bond's price. Credit risk is the risk that an issuer will default on payments of interest and principal. This risk is higher when investing in high yield bonds, also known as junk bonds, which have lower ratings and are subject to greater volatility. Government bonds are guaranteed as to payment of principal and interest by the U.S. government if held to maturity. Although government bonds are considered free from credit risk, they are subject to interest rate risk. Securitized assets include mortgage-related and asset-backed securities. These securities are subject to prepayment and extension risks. Changes in prepayments may significantly affect yield, average life and expected maturity. Extension risk may result from a rise in interest rates, which tends to make mortgage-backed securities, asset-backed securities, and other callable debt securities more volatile. Bond ratings, issued by private independent ratings services, are a grade given to bonds which is designed to indicate the credit quality of the bond. Bonds rated Aaa through Baa3 by Moody's and AAA through BBB- by S&P, are typically considered to be investment grade. Investors should note that an investment grade rating does not insure the bond against default and does not guarantee the return of principal.
